 - Support of ShareLife Catholic Charities, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Canadian Food for Children, Terry Fox Foundation
 - Faithful Fridays with St. Catherine of Siena Pastoral Team
 - Focus on Stewardship of the Earth and Environment, with Eco initiatives in partnership with the City of Mississauga; fostering and maintaining platinum status
 - Staff and Student Liturgies to honour Thanksgiving, Remembrance Day, Advent, Lent, Easter
 - School community masses with St. Catherine of Siena Parish to worship together including school opening and closing, and for celebrations of Sacraments, Graduation and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
 - Health Action Team which helps us to focus on the connection between mind, body and spirit as we focus on mental health initiatives, through Christian mediation, prayer, music and mindfulness exercises

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

To celebrate OCSGE, we as a school community....

As developed by the Institute of Catholic Education (ICE), the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE) are used as a framework for designing Ontario Catholic curriculum. At St. Timothy School, the OCSGE's are integrated in the teaching and learning in all of our classrooms from Kindergarten to Grade 8, as Catholic education views human life as an integration of body, mind, and spirit. Our instructional practices reflect the knowledge, skills and mindset embodied in these expectations, and recognize the importance of the development of the whole child in terms of values, attitudes and actions. Furthermore, ongoing review, implementation and reflection around these expectations are evidenced in our monthly newsletters, conversations and actions with staff, students and the community at large.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

At St. Timothy school, our Catholic faith community is rooted in a set of common beliefs about God's will for all people. The month-at-a-time format provides the whole school with a common language to move and celebrate through the school year. This program provides vocabulary and milestones for a continuous school-wide conversation and culture about how we can creatively maintain a safe, caring school community that reflects the values and teachings of Jesus Christ. Classroom liturgies and celebrations that highlight our virtues and the liturgical calendar allow opportunities for students to experience our virtues in actions. Announcements and daily prayers highlight our Gospel values: reminding students what each virtue looks like, feels like, and sounds like in the classroom and in the school yard. Scripture stories are integrated into the Religion curriculum and throughout our daily activities. Our Gospel values are the foundation for all that we do at St. Timothy School and the community at large. In addition, ongoing communication of our virtues in action with all our families are continuously highlighted via newsletters, meetings, celebrations, community building events, and in all that we say and do, as we grow, learn and serve in the love of Christ.

Visible Signs of our Faith: Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

We have ... Crosses, Bibles, Prayer Tables, community service

Signs of our faith are visible as soon as one enters the front doors of the school and are visible throughout the school hallways and classrooms. The altar and the large display cases in the school's front foyer reflect the liturgical seasons of the Church year and the virtue banners are reminders of our Gospel values. Each classroom has a sacred space and a cross, as the classroom prayer tables are an interactive focal point with the colour of the tablecloth and the symbols on the table changing to align with the liturgical colours, seasons and virtues. A portrait of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, a large statue of our patron saint, St. Timothy, diverse images of our Holy Mother, and our school prayer are permanently displayed in the front hallway. Our front foyer also has an electronic display which highlights photos of students, staff and our community demonstrating faith in action; learning and serving in the love of Christ.
